Remarks of the Counsellor:

• I am part of Tolani College of Commerce as the general psychological counsellor. I am truly delighted to work with this institution as the teachers and coordinators are as helpful as they can possibly be. They are extremely keen on following the feedback and making sure that the students receive the help they need.

• Most of the students I have interacted with, come with issues of difficulty in concentration. The transition from school to college is quite a bit for them. The new found freedom somehow makes them feel lost. They experience identity crisis and lot of peer pressure. They wish to explore the world but also want to

feel safe. In this tumultuous time, having a counsellor makes them feel grounded. The issues faced have been multi-folded due to Covid situation. These sessions were conducted online where few students did not join as there was lack of privacy at their homes. We did use the technology where few students type and few used headphones to achieve the privacy.

The students also have to cope up with rejections and failures. The privacy of the counselling room makes them open up promptly and they know they're in a nonjudgmental safe zone, where confidentiality is the key word. This makes my job easier. I have been able to build rapport with the students and some even come for follow-up (known as 'Repeat Clients').

Feedback of the counsellor:
